Responsible Behaviour

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There is an expectation that professionals will at all times display responsible behaviour as they take to executing their craft in whatever form of business, sports, cultural or entertainment activity in which they are engaged. It is an established fact that there are a set of professional ethics which are associated with various vocations and industries. The expected behaviours do bear some relation to the industry standards. Those who fail to comply, for whatever reason, must remain conscious of the fact that in doing so, they run the risk of impacting negatively on their individual character and image.

In the 2014 Caribbean Premier League Cricket played here in the Caribbean, the world watched as the West Indies Cricket captain, Damesh Ramdin, threw his bat to the ground in disgust after the fall of a wicket. Many will recall his actions in England during the course of a Test Match, when he pulled a paper from his pocket, the apparent intent of which was to publicly communicate a message to Sir. Vivian Richards.

At the 2014 PIC-O-DE-CROP Calypso Finals in Barbados, the audience was treated to a presentation by the calypsonian with the stage name of 'The Announcer'. Many in questioning

the contents of the presentation deemed it to have been offensive. Professional sportspersons and entertainers, and those amateurs who receive some form of remuneration, must recognize that at end of the day, the paying patrons contribute significantly to their pay packets. The authorities and management should move with haste to stamp out any form of indiscipline, wherever it exists.

Those who run afoul ought to be aware that whereupon an apology is sometimes offered and accepted, the damage which has already been done cannot be repaired.

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
