Workers' Solidarity

"Lack of unions and alternate employment opportunities all contribute to the disempowerment of the individual worker and create the corresponding social climate where it is acceptable to consider workers as less than citizens and their lives expendable. It can be deduced from this point of view that trade unions are required to play a pivotal role in the of promotion of worker solidarity. There is seemingly no good reason why trade unions should be scoffed or frown upon, dismissed as useless and meaningless, or reduce to cinderella status.

Those who share any of these perspectives may be deemed as being ignorant of the role of trade unions, narrow minded, and/ or mischievous. It may be that there are also groups of individuals who because of their narrow interests, be it political or otherwise, would want to denounce the relevance of trade unions. The perceived threat of the trade unions through unification, may be advanced as the single reason for the apparent fear of the labour movement .

It has long be established that the role of trade unions is to represent, protect, inform and provide services for employees at the workplace, local and national level. The functions of trade unions are but an extension of its role, for trade unions represent workers, negotiate on the behalf of workers, whilst engaging the collective bargaining process, lobby for change in government policies and laws that will benefit workers, agitate for a high standard of living for workers, press demands for workers' participation in the decision making process, and promote good employer - employee relations.

In times of crisis, it is to be expected that the strength, fortitude and character of trade unions will be tested. The level of attack is usually levied at the leadership of trade unions. This comes from both within and outside the walls of the organization. Members of trade unions must be conscious of the fact that in times of crisis, this usual line of attack is intended to erode confidence in the leadership, to destabilize the organization, and derail it from the path it is pursuing.

In an effort to build and maintain trade union solidarity, is important to remind members of trade unions that they have a responsibility to guide and support the leadership. On the other hand, unions and unionized workers need to reach out to non-unionized workers and seek legislative improvements for all.

Trade union solidarity has been mainly responsible for the achievements that labour has gained over the years. In an imperfect world, it is likely that there will be shortcomings and disappointments, but there is the consolation that through collective wisdom and efforts, some effective remedies can be found.

Kofi Annan made the observation that "When economic conditions are difficult, people tend to be less generous and protect themselves; the question of solidarity doesn't mean much to them at that time." In a climate of recession or where pressures are being imposed on trade unions, workers are urged never to lose sight of the importance of workers' solidarity, for it certainly makes the difference to the safeguarding of the rights and freedoms they enjoy.
